Nomination Instructions

Members of the Duke community or community partner organizations may nominate eligible students, faculty members, or community partners (individuals or organizations) for a Betsy Alden Outstanding Service-Learning Award.

Submit a statement (approximately 500 words) explaining why the nominee deserves the award, based on the selection criteria below.

- Student Nominations: Submit a statement (approximately 500 words) explaining why the nominee deserves the award, based on the selection criteria below.
 - In addition, the student nominee must provide a short description or reflection on their service-learning experiences at Duke. Please share the instructions below with the student as early as possible (ideally by the first week of March) to allow them time to prepare their statement before the nomination deadline, typically the week after Spring Break.

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Eligibility

The following individuals are eligible for a Betsy Alden Award:

- Graduating Seniors who have participated in at least one Duke service-learning course.
- Faculty Members who have taught at least one service-learning course at Duke.
- **Community Partners** who have collaborated with Duke students and faculty in service-learning initiatives.

Selection Criteria

- Graduating Seniors:
 - Demonstrated leadership, initiative, or ongoing commitment to academic servicelearning.
 - Quality of reflection about the service-learning experience.
- Faculty:
 - Meaningful integration of service experiences with course content (e.g., structured service, selection of community partners, use of critical reflection).
 - Consideration of and commitment to community partners' needs.
 - Long-term commitment to service-learning and the Duke service-learning community.
- Community Partners:
 - Commitment to the academic and personal development of Duke students.
 - Collaboration with Duke students and faculty members.
 - Length and depth of involvement with Duke service-learning initiatives.

About Betsy Alden

Referred to as one of the "founding mothers" of service-learning at Duke, Betsy Alden began blending learning and service in the 1980s. Over a decade, she transformed service-learning at Duke into a vibrant, cross-disciplinary practice.

For Betsy Alden, service-learning is about building humane relationships and connecting to deeper ideals of reciprocity, partnership, and sustained community commitment.
